Executive Summary

On July 28, 2022 (12:00 pm-1:00 pm ET), CDC's Division of Laboratory Systems (DLS) hosted a virtual training for OneLab Network members titled "Introducing OneLab REACH: CDC's New Laboratory Learning Management System." All OneLab network members (2100+) were invited, with 123 in attendance.

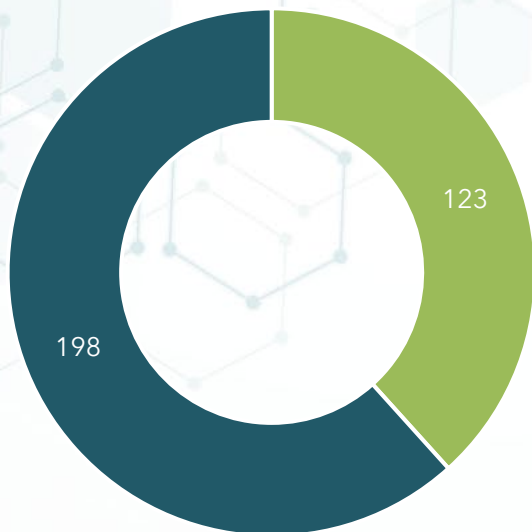
To begin the event, Kelly Winter, PhD, MPH (CDC) welcomed the attendees and provided an overview of new OneLab resources, including the *Laboratory Communications Toolkit* and *Sensitivity and Specificity Job Aid*.

Following this, Dr. Winter conducted a 15-minute demonstration of OneLab REACH, CDC's new learning management system (LMS) for clinical and public health laboratory professionals, and announced it is now available to the network. The demonstration showcased a screen recording of all user functions of OneLab REACH and briefly explained each function in the site.

After the demonstration, a live Q&A took place. An invitation to complete the post-event survey was provided. The presenter also shared a brief description of the upcoming CDC OneLab events taking place in August and September.
